



Before you sign, please review **ONE-STOP APPLICATION** or **AUTHORIZATION TO VOTE (ATV)** form.

**CHECK YOUR NAME.**

- Is your current name printed on the form?
- Is your current name spelled correctly on the form?

**CHECK YOUR ADDRESS.**

- Is your correct residential address listed on the form?
- If applicable, is your current address listed on the form?
- Will you have lived at this address at least 30 days before election day?

**READ THIS STATEMENT:**

Beginning in 2016, You will need a PHOTO ID to vote. Do you have one of these?

**DIRECT ATTENTION TO THE COLOR POSTER OF VOTER ID'S**

If the voter indicates he or she ***DOES NOT*** have one of the forms of Photo ID on the chart, direct the voter to sign the *Acknowledgment of No Photo ID* on the form, and ensure the voter signs in both places. Then provide the voter with the card on obtaining Photo ID.

## IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST-TIME VOTERS

Federal law (Help America Vote Act of 2002) and state law (GS § 163-166.12) set requirements for certain voters to show identification when they vote. These requirements apply to any voter who has:

- 1) Newly registered to vote in a county.
- 2) Has not previously voted in an election that includes a ballot item for federal office in North Carolina.
- 3) Did not provide on their voter registration application, a valid North Carolina driver license number or the last four digits of their social security number, or did not provide a copy of an identification document when the application was submitted.

These ***first-time*** voters must present to a local election official one of the following:

- 1) A current and valid photo identification (refer to list of acceptable photo identification).
- 2) A copy of one of the following documents that shows the name and address of the voter: a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document.

## VOTING IN CORRECT PRECINCT

North Carolina law requires voters to vote in their proper precinct based on the address where they have resided for at least **30 days** before the date of an election.

### **GS § 163-55(a)**

Every person born in the United States, and every person who has been naturalized, and who shall have resided in the ***precinct*** in which the person offers to vote for 30 days next preceding an election, shall, if otherwise qualified, be qualified to vote in any election held in this State in the ***precinct*** in which the person resides. Removal from one ***precinct*** to another ***precinct*** shall not operate to deprive any person of the right to vote in the ***precinct*** from which the person has removed until 30 days after the person's removal.
